Speaker 0 Good, today is April 7th 2021. There are 30,596,830 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the United States and 544,420 have died. In Wisconsin, there are 639,553 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 7,341 deaths. For a start, how was your experience with the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:00:39 Well my experience was very very good, and I made the effort to return for my second vaccine because I have noticed that, well, many people have died and, well, the truth is that we have to prevent this illness or prepare ourselves so that we stay healthy. And, well, let's hope that more doctors or nurses study [the virus], right? So that they can help those of us, and, I am grateful for their help and accept it. I give thanks to everyone for inviting us to get vaccinated. I am proud of the vaccine and thank you, seriously. Yes.

Speaker 2 00:01:37 Ahm [indistinct voices in the background] And how has your daily life changed after receiving the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:01:43 Well more, more than anything I can go anywhere. Now I go with much confidence. Now, now I am not scared of getting sick, now I am vaccinated and well truly I say thank you again for the vaccine and today I came to get my second dose and let's hope that we'll be okay.

Speaker 0 00:02:14 Yes, yes I see. Hmmm did you know that the state of Wisconsin has had the fastest response to the launch of the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:02:25 Hmmm, yes, yes.

Speaker 0 00:02:26 And what do you think about this?

Speaker 1 00:02:28 Well, very good. Yes, because they have more... I can tell you that... there's a faster reaction from the doctors. They do their job very well. And, well, they are helping people get vaccinated quicker in this state. And that is very good. Yes.

Speaker 2 00:03:03 [indistinct conversation in the background] Hmmm and what do you think of the nursing students that administer the vaccine?

Speaker 1 Mmm. That administer?

Speaker 0 00:03:16 Yes, the nursing students here today.

Speaker 1 00:03:23 I don't understand. What?

Speaker 2 00:03:26 Ahm. How was the service of the students?

Speaker 1 00:03:29 Oh, the service was perfect. It was very good. Yes, in fact, well when they give you the vaccine you never feel the vaccine, they do a very good job. Yes, a very good job. Yes, thank you.

Speaker 0 00:03:40 Ahm. How was the clinic today and the first time? In what manner was it good or bad?

Speaker 1 00:03:48 [laughter in the background] Good. Good. Yes, always, the first time I went was very good and very good. Yes. And the second time as well. Yes. Thank you for the vaccine and for always treating us well.

Speaker 2 00:04:04 Do you have any recommendations so that we are able to better the clinic in the future?

Speaker 1 00:04:14 A recommendation? I can recommend that my friends and others who have not been vaccinated, that they can be vaccinated, right?
