Abstract: This is an interview following up after the interviewee received the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccine. Questions are asked about the side effects of the vaccine, the changes in their everyday lives, their feelings about receiving the vaccine, the attitudes of their boss and co-workers, the opinion that they have about the vaccination campaign being carried out by the state of Wisconsin, and his suggestions for the future of the clinic.

Speaker 0 00:00:01 Is it okay if we start recording the interview?

Speaker 1 Sure.

Speaker 0 Ahm. To start, today is April 14, 2021. There are 31,076,891 confirmed Covid-19 cases in the United States, and there are 559,741 deaths. In Wisconsin there are 586,632 confirmed cases of Covid-19, and 6,690 deaths. To start [sound of papers] the questions, how has your experience been with the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccine?

Speaker 1 It has been normal, no problem.

Speaker 0 Okay, did you feel sick?

Speaker 1 No. [conversation in the background]

Speaker 0 Does your boss support receiving the vaccine?

Speaker 1 Yes.

Speaker 0 Okay, and what about your co-workers?

Speaker 1 They do too.

Speaker 0 Okay. I know you do not feel sick, do you know someone who has been sick after receiving the Covid-19 vaccine?

Speaker 1 No.

Speaker 0 No, okay. Why did you decide to come back to the clinic today for your second dose

of the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:01:27 Well, to be sure I'm going to be okay.

Speaker 0 00:01:29 Sure, for protection.

Speaker 1 Yes, for protection.

Speaker 0 Has your daily life changed after you received the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:01:37 No, it is normal. Working, is all in order.

Speaker 0 00:01:39 Ah. Do you feel more confident spending time with other people after receiving the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:01:49 Yes, because I feel that I am protected. [voices in the background]

Speaker 0 00:01:51 In my opinion, I feel more confident spending time with other people when those people also have the vaccine.

Speaker 1 Me as well.

Speaker 0 Ahm, did you know that the state of Wisconsin has the fastest response to the release of the vaccine?

Speaker 1 No, I did not know that.

Speaker 0 Ah, what do you think about this?

Speaker 1 It is good, well, I suppose that it is. Well, they have been working very well. It is very good that they work for the good of all.

Speaker 0 00:02:23 Ahm. Do you have any opinion of the other forty nine states that are behind Wisconsin with quickly responding to the release?

Speaker 1 00:02:37 Well, no, normal- well because they should always be ready to advance in the same way. [stammer]

Speaker 0 00:02:45 What do you think about all of the nursing students that administer the vaccine?

Speaker 1 00:02:53 Well, it is good. Because it makes it easier for me, I don't have to go farther. I only have to go nearby. It is good for me.

Speaker 0 00:03:00 How was it coming to the clinic today, and for the first time? What way was it good or bad?

Speaker 1 Good, it's good. Yes.

Speaker 0 There was no problem?

Speaker 1 No, it is all good. [conversation in the background]

Speaker 0 Ahm. One more question. Do you have any recommendations so that we can better the clinic in the future?

Speaker 1 00:03:21 No, I believe that it is all good. No. Nothing to improve. From my point of view, all is good.

Speaker 0 00:03:26 Good. This is the end of the interview. Do you have any more comments?

Speaker 1 00:03:30 No, thank you for helping me, and I hope that you continue to help more people so that we all are well. Because we all need to be well so that nobody is sick and less people die, it is better for everyone to be well. Thank you. Thank you, really. [voices in the background]
